# All in it Together

## Nehemiah 3

Small Group Study, week commencing 20th September 2021

### For Starters

Recall a time when you were part of a team and together you achieved something worthwhile. What made it memorable?

#### Read

Nehemiah 3:1-14 (at least!), and ideally the whole chapter.

### Context

Nehemiah has established the extent of the work necessary to rebuild the wall. He has presented his proposal to the Jews living in Jerusalem, and they have responded positively to the proposal. "Let us start rebuilding" (2:18). But it's one thing to have a vision and a plan, and another thing to execute it. In chapter 3 the work begins...

#### Study

1. The rebuilding work wasn't a job for professional builders. What kind of people took part in the repair of the wall? What would you have said to someone who didn't want to get involved because "they didn't have the gift of masonry"?

Notice, for example, a perfume-maker (8), a goldsmith (8), and the priests (1,22,28) all actively involved.

2. The people organised themselves as communities (2,7,13) and families (3,12), and where appropriate tackled sections of the wall that were close to home (10). What were the strengths of this approach?

3. Notice how people from Jericho (2) and Tekoa (5) got stuck in, even though they didn't live in Jerusalem; and likewise people from Gibeon and Mizpah (7), who were under the governor of Samaria. What does this suggest about our involvement in the life of the wider church, not just our own local congregation? Why should we be involved in activities that don't directly benefit us?

4. One sad exception to the community rebuilding project were certain nobles who "would not put their shoulders to the work under their supervisors" (6). Poet Robert Frost once said, "The world is full of willing people, some willing to work, the rest willing to let them." How can we guard against a "consumer mentality" towards church and God's work generally?

5. The chapter is a record of many people's names. Why did the author of Nehemiah record them all? What is the practical implication for us?

6. Where do you see opportunities for 'building' in CBC at the moment? How would you be willing to contribute?
