## Study

- 1. Read out Philippians 2:5–11, and remind yourselves of Ephesians 5:21. How does Jesus' example model what it looks like to 'submit to one another'?
- 2. Re-read Ephesians 5:22-33. If you are married, what has been your experience of love and submission? If you are single, to what extent do you think these verses are relevant to you?
- 3. Think about a marriage that you consider to be an example worth emulating. What is it about that relationship that inspires you? How does it reflect the relationship between Christ and the church?
- 4. Re-read Ephesians 6:1-4. What are the key principles Paul is teaching here? Does there come a point when is a child is no longer required to obey their parents? If so, when is it?
- 5. Re-read Ephesians 6:5-9. What is there in this first century instruction to slaves and masters that is relevant to our own time, culture and working environments?
- 6. Remind yourselves of the start of this study, and Christ's example as described in Philippians 2:5-11. Thinking about all of your relationships, where do you need the most grace to live out the principles of love and mutual submission set out in tonight's study?
